

Sara Morley LaCroix, Founder The Kalamazoo Anti-Human Trafficking Coalition

The Kalamazoo Anti Human Trafficking Coalition, (KAHTC) is a community based volunteer organization created to fight the demand of human trafficking, raise the awareness of human trafficking and to uncover resources and assistance for human trafficking survivors all by collaborative efforts. Together with the Junior League of Kalamazoo, KAHTC advocates for legislation at the state level to benefit the anti-human trafficking cause in Michigan. KAHTC provides training to the education, medical, and law enforcement professionals who would be the most likely to come in contact with human trafficking victims, as well as training adolescents how to avoid being targeted by traffickers. Finally, they coordinate services for people coming out of a trafficking situation, working with organizations to provide housing, counseling, medical help and transition aid. http://www.kahtc.org

About Sara

Sara, born in Saginaw, moved to Kalamazoo with her family in 2000 after her husband Tom, served 12 years in the U.S. Navy. Together they have raised four children. All have attended Kalamazoo Public Schools and benefit from the Promise. Sara served as the Navy Wives Club President in Idaho Falls, Idaho and an U.S. Naval Command Ombudsman while living in Washington State. Once settled in Kalamazoo Sara joined the Junior League of Kalamazoo and is in her 11th year of membership. She serves on the membership committee and is the Assistant Chair of the State Public Affairs Committee. Sara was made aware of the issue of human trafficking in 2009 when it was discussed at a Junior League meeting in Lansing. From that point on she has made it her priority to raise the awareness about human trafficking. In February of 2012 after attending a human trafficking conference in Grand Rapids she came back to Kalamazoo and started the conversation and the Kalamazoo Anti Human Trafficking Coalition was formed. Sara serves on the boards of Parents for Public Schools of Greater Kalamazoo, Morley Foundation, and is Assistant Chair of the Governmental Affairs Committee at the Greater Kalamazoo Association of Realtors.



Showers




....AND SPEAKING OF ENVELOPES.....


