

"The Secret of Life"

What is your philosophy of life? I admit that I don't always live by the precepts of the Sermon on the Mount. I don't structure my life by the ideas of St. Benedict or Mother Teresa often enough. Do you live your life by the words of Jesus? Or is the voice of your conscience the words of your mother or your father? Actually, the words that I hear in my head often belong to James Taylor or Carole King (I'm dating myself). "The secret of life is enjoying the passage of time," James says in one of his songs. I'm feeling that lately. It's strange, but I am enjoying the passage of time and that is especially poignant to me as we head into 2015.

As lots of you know this was the first Christmas that none of our children were home with us. Brandon and Annie were in Boston, and Kendall, of course, is in the Philippines doing her mission work. It's sad that they are not with us to celebrate the holiday, but it is also happy because it means that their lives no longer revolve around us, that they have grown up (mostly). I think I'm excited about that also, but I'm not really sure yet. Maybe I won't enjoy all of this. It probably won't happen until the fall of 2016, so I have some time to get ready. Whew!

### The Church Resource Center

The movie, Unbroken, opened in local theaters on Christmas Day. It is based on the book, *Unbroken*, by Laura Hillenbrand. A copy of this book is in the Family Resource Center (FRC). It is based upon the life of Louis Zamperini: a delinquent as a boy and a runner in the 1936 Berlin Olympics. Louis became an airman during World War II, "embarking on a journey that led to his doomed flight, a tiny raft, and a drift into the unknown." Captured by the Japanese, driven to the limits of endurance, using his ingenuity to survive, Louis unknowingly began a sporadic journey of faith which ultimately impacted the lives of many people. This book is a fast read—one you will not want to put down. If you plan to see the movie, you may want to read it before seeing the film.



Another book in the FRC which deals with an individual who endured significant tests of endurance is *The Real George Washington* by Jay A. Parry, Andrew M. Allison, and W. Cleon Skousen. As we sit in our comfortably warm homes this winter, you may want to read of the conditions George Washington and his troops endured on Christmas Day as they crossed the Delaware River in preparation for a risky attack on the town of Trenton. This event, along with many others not only challenged the endurance and faith of Washington and his troops, but also required ingenuity in order to survive.


