

A Minute to Learn: International Transgender Day of Visibility (TDOV)

March 31st is International Transgender Day of Visibility. On TDOV we celebrate the accomplishments and contributions of transgender and gender non-

conforming people; recognize the diversity of transgender identities; raise awareness about the discrimination faced by transgender people; and support the transgender community. Over the past 3 years, we have seen record numbers of anti-transgender legislation introduced in the US. These proposed (and sometimes passed) laws restrict or outright ban access to healthcare, education, athletics, legal rights, and more. In 2023 alone, there are already over 380 anti-transgender bills under consideration. 
