



A Minute to Learn: November is Transgender Awareness Month, and November 20th is Transgender Day of Remembrance (TDoR). TDoR is a day to recognize and remember those transgender people who lost their lives due to anti-transgender violence. It was created in 1999 by Gwendolyn Ann Smith to honor the memory of Rita Hester, a Black transgender woman whose violent 1998 murder is still unsolved. Hester was not the first woman murdered for being transgender, and sadly, she was not the last. A disproportionate number of victims are Black transgender women. TDoR memorial events typically include the reading of names of transgender people lost



from October 1 of the prior year to September 30 of the current year. In 2021, US Representative from Massachusetts Ayanna Pressley read the names of 46 transgender murder victims, with members of the Congressional LGBTQ+ Equity Caucus by her side. There are 34 names on the Oct 2022-Sep 2023 list compiled by

GLAAD (https://glaad.org/tdor-memoriam/ ). Of those 34, six were murdered in Michigan:

**Dede Ricks**, 33, a Black trans woman, was killed in Detroit, MI on August 27.

**Hayden Davis**, 28, a Black trans woman, was killed in Detroit, MI on July 25.

**Shawmaynè Giselle Marie**, 27, a Black trans woman, was killed in Gulfport, MI on June 21.

**Ray Muscat**, 24, a white trans man, was killed in Township, MI on May 8.

Kenyatta "Kesha" Webster, 24, a Black trans woman, was killed in Jackson, MI on March 26.

**Naomie Skinner**, 25, a Black trans woman, was killed in Highland Park, MI on February 12.

## Word of The Month: Nephesh!

Mark has been starting the weekly staff meeting with a question from Micah 6:8:

"What does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?"

It is always interesting to see where the conversation will go!

One week Mark provided some history and commentary about Micah's ministry. He was a prophet at the same time as Isaiah. Isaiah served larger, urban communities with significant wealth. Micah served regions which were rural and were not affluent. The question he posed to his followers was rhetorical. He didn't ask for riches. He asked them to commit their lives by doing justice, loving kindness and walking humbly with God.

The week prior I had learned the term nephesh in my Hebrew class. Most words in Hebrew have a range of meaning and nephesh is a prime example! Nephesh can mean throat, neck, breath, blood; being, self, life;



people, member of household; personality, soul, corpse.

If we can commit our nephesh to doing justice, loving kindness and walking with God we are off to a great start!


#### **KidsFirst**
